Christmas In New York

December 2 - 4, 2011

Anticipation will be in the crisp winter air when we go on our annual trip to New York City during the holiday season. It is no secret that you will be dazzled by the bright lights on Broadway and the traditional visit to Radio City Music Hall to see "The Christmas Spectacular" starring the world famous Rockettes. This year new productions will be featured as well as a groundbreaking 3DLIVE video adventure. There will be time for a pre-holiday shopping spree, going to a trendy restaurant, taking in a special Broadway show, or to just take time to enjoy the sights and sounds while in the city that never sleeps.

The bus will depart at 6:00 A.M. on Friday, December 2, 2011. We shall make various rest stops en route. A box lunch will be provided to our arrival in New York City.

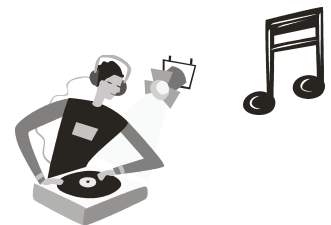
